Key Stage One

Reading is the cornerstone of learning; reading regularly has a significant impact on your child's working brain and those who can read fluently by the time they reach the end of **Kst** 1 are at an advantage for accessing all

areas of the curriculum fully. We are promoting more regular reading at home in kst1, so we are setting the children a Reading Challenge – to read 5 days in a row. Simply sign in your child's reading book for any 5 consecutive days as they read to you. Your child will then be entered in a prize draw at the end of term and could win a huge, plush Big Ted!

Key Stage Two



Our Year 4's conquered Chester House this week.


We pride ourselves on giving children

Lab 13 Science Competition



Our Summer 2024 competition focus is all about raising the profile of science in our schools and emphasising how science doesn't have to be complicated or expensive.

We would like children from years 3-6 to design their own science activity using everyday materials from school or home. For example:

- Can a sundial be made from cardboard?
- What effect does vinegar have on a boiled egg?
- Is it possible to make chalk from eggshells?
- What sauces are best for cleaning old coins?
- Is it possible to make a magnifying glass with two materials?
- What's the biggest bubble that can be made?

Children should explain their activity and what they have learnt in either a poster or presentation of their choice.

Prizes:


After all entries have been judged, we will announce the winning entries from each school. Each
